



INTRODUCTION

This report presents the research findings from the study commissioned by Ring and produced by Fluent Research.

The study was conducted online with a nationally representative sample of 1,001 homeowners ages 18 to 74, who own a smartphone.

In addition, we surveyed a separate sample of 100 current users of Ring products.

The data was collected in October-November 2017.





Neighborhood Crime


More than one in four U.S. homeowners (28%) have been a victim of home burglary



One in four reported burglaries occurred within this or last year


When the home burglary occurred

The average value of stolen goods in the last burglary was \$2,000



Nearly one third of U.S. homeowners (30%) report that someone in their neighborhood has been a victim of home burglary in the last year



Home burglaries are on the rise and only 25% of homeowners say that crime in the neighborhood is not a problem






- A very big problem 5%
- A moderate problem 21%
- A small problem 49%
- Not a problem 25%



Home burglaries a bigger problem than in past years

- Much more of a problem 16%
- Somewhat more of a problem 34%
- The same as in past years 40%
- Less of a problem 10%



Neighborhood crime a bigger problem than in past years

- Much more of a problem 8%
- Somewhat more of a problem 22%
- The same as in past years 56%
- Less of a problem 14%
